



As she scours the city looking for her, she encounters Dom, a friendly but annoying tramp who won't leave her alone. MENASHE (2017, USA) Dir. Joshua Z. Weinstein. Set—and secretly shot—within Brooklyn's ultra-orthodox Jewish community, a good-hearted grocery store clerk struggles against tradition to keep custody of his only son after his wife passes away.
